

RESOLUTION NO. 560

DETERMINATION THAT THE ALBANY COUNTY HIGHWAY PAVEMENT PROJECTS WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT

By Audit and Finance Committee:

WHEREAS, Albany County proposes to rehabilitate 20.6 miles of various County roadways using a recycled asphalt process described in the County's Highway Pavement Recycling Program, and

WHEREAS, The project is proposed for 1.7 miles of CR 52 (Elm/Cherry Avenue) from Kenwood Avenue to NYS Route 32 in the Town of Bethlehem; 1.6 miles of CR 151 (Albany Shaker Road) from CR 153 to CR 157 in the Town of Colonie; 3.3 miles of CR 202 (Meadowdale Road) in the Towns of Guilderland and New Scotland, 2.3 miles of CR 253 (Bozenkill Road) in the Town of Knox, 2.7 miles of CR 303 (Pinnacle Road) from CR 311 to Wolf Hill Road in the Towns of Berne and New Scotland, .7 miles of CR 306 (Krumkill Road) from CR 203 to Font Grove Road in the Town of New Scotland, 2.3 miles of CR 306 (Font Grove Road) from Krumkill Road to Bethlehem/New Scotland Town line in the Town of New Scotland, and 6 miles of CR 408 (Fancher Road) from CR 1 to CR 402 in the Towns of Berne and Westerlo, and

WHEREAS, The project involves milling the existing asphalt surface to a depth of about three inches and after screening to remove deleterious matter, blending the milled material with liquid asphalt to produce recycled asphalt ready for reapplication and surface treatment, and

WHEREAS, The proposed work is subject to the requirements of State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617, and

WHEREAS, Albany County has assumed the designation of Lead Agency for the purpose of compliance with SEQR, and

WHEREAS, The Albany County Department of Economic Development, Conservation and Planning, acting on behalf of the Albany County Legislature, has reviewed the proposed action and has complied with all applicable administrative and procedural requirements on behalf of the County, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Albany County Legislature has considered the findings of the Department of Economic Development, Conservation and Planning

and has determined that the proposed project is a Type II action and will not have a significant effect on the environment, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That no other determinations or procedures are required with respect to this proposed project in accordance with the requirements set forth in the applicable administrative and procedural requirements of SEQR, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the County Legislature is directed to forward certified copies of this resolution to the appropriate County Officials.
